STRAT~O~MATIC BASEBALL ~ Strat~O~Matic is a baseball dice probabil~ ity board game. Along with the concepts of fair play and good sports~ manship, the game primarily focuses on two objectives while incorpo~ rating the sport of baseball. The objectives of the game will enable stu dents to: understand the probability of a chance event is a number (between 0 and 1) which expresses the likelihood of such event occur ring. develop a uniform probability model by assigning equal probabil~ ity to all outcomes, and use the model to determine probabilities of events.
STUDENT COUNCIL ~ Student Council is open to all ROBMS students, to provide community service as well as plan activities which promote school spirit. We have several themed Spirit Weeks during the school year. Student Council also hosts the Talent Show in the Spring.
Vocal Ensemble ~ Vocal Ensemble is a small singing group of no more than 30 members.
